

## News from Business Meeting

Expo is this weekend! Volunteers for working at the booth should call Leon (404-432-3824) when you arrive and he will meet you at the entrance to the exhibit hall and give you an exhibiter name tag to get in free.

We have given out 164 layettes (16,114 items) this year. We have given 22 burials.

We have a number of sergers on loan. If they are not being used we would like them back to lend to others.

It was suggested that we apply for a grant or serger from Babylock's charity.

The Smocking guild donated several boxes of hats, dresses, and burial envelopes to us. Maria Korosi is sorting them to see how many we can use. Jill will take the ones that are too large to the clinics.

We do not need to purchase any fabric at this time. We have plenty of knits, fleece, flannel and tote bag fabric. While we would like a better selection of quilt fabric, we need to use what we have. Therefore **we will no longer reimburse for purchases other than yarn and batting**. We may need material for burials, but will look for a substitute fabric for the batiste we have been using.

We have the fabric from the uniform shirts available in the warehouse. The can be used for bibs, burp cloths, and lap pads, either in the middle or on the back. It takes 4 of the large back pieces to back a quilt.

Remember, print knits should be used for sleeves or tops for two piece sleepers only. (We have 8 shelves of solid knits and 1 of prints.)

Susan Larsen donated a box of yarn to us. She will be writing a column for the Gwinnett Daily Post about us this month or next.

Some is making receiving blankets that are larger than our standard 30" square. Please stay with our sizes. Also they should be cut so there is the 30-31" strip and a 12-14" strip that can be used for bibs and burp cloths.

We try to supply thread, but if sergers would be willing to buy their own, it would be appreciated.
