

Discipleship Team End of Year Report - 2014

The discipleship team is every member of the congregation and this congregation proves it over and over.

The leaders of the team are responsible for organizing Bible study, prayer groups, retreats, Sunday school, children's church and vacation Bible school. With the leadership of the Director of Christian Education the team was able to fulfill these responsibilities.

Three different Bible studies and several book studies were offered. There were both ladies' Bible study and men's prayer group on a weekly basis. The ladies enjoyed an inspiring and meaningful retreat. Different Sunday school classes were offered for both adults and children as well as Godly Play and children's church.

Vacation Bible school was offered for six Sundays at 9:30am, in lieu of Sunday school, where the children heard Bible studies, did crafts, had playtime outside, and were served a hot breakfast. The team would like to see this concept expanded by reaching out into the community well before school is out.

In addition, many Christian education visual aides were added to Sunday worship. A woven communion cloth was created from meaningful statements written by the congregation on cloth strips. Candles were added to the communion table giving the children the opportunity to take turns serving as acolytes. Order of service icons in the bulletin helped illustrate to young children each activity during worship service. The sanctuary was adorned with Advent illustration paintings, and for the second year an Advent booklet was printed for the congregation.

- A new Women's Bible Study on *Daniel* by Beth Moore was approved.
- Session elected Penny as elder/moderator and Mary Ann Sheehy as elder-at-large on the 2015 Nominating Committee.

Evangelism/Mission

Being a member of the body of Christ at Grace places you immediately on our Evangelism and Missions team. Evangelism and Missions includes every-day, every hour opportunities to show by your actions and through personal testimony of faith the good news of Jesus Christ. Your Evangelism and Missions Team is here to encourage your participation in local, regional and even international missions projects. Grace has always been known as a Missions Church and our intent is to remain focused on the needs we find in our community and beyond.

In 2014 our first project, named "Little Free Library," was a suggestion brought to us by a deacon and approved by the Session early in the year. The premise is: sharing books builds community. The original "Little Free Library" was built in the shape of a one room school house in memory of the founders mother who was a school teacher. The book box was placed in his front yard with a sign "Take a book, Return a book." Today it is a non-profit organization where the library boxes can be registered and plans for little libraries can be found. Our "Little Free Library" was erected on December 4th. It was built and designed by Gary Pichon and looks like Grace. Catherine Pichon and Mary Ann Sheehy painted the library box and Hubert Tinsley placed the structure for us near the big Oak Tree at the Hwy. 53 entrance. A story about the library has been published in the newspaper to alert the public where it is and how it can be used. David performed the dedication after Church on the 14th and I hope that many of you attended!

Internationally the congregation was asked to monetarily support a request brought to us by Dr. Larry Anderson. Larry's son William is a chaplain and was stationed in Afghanistan. William's commanding officer asked him to enhance troop morale. William asked for patriotic decorations and anything to keep the men cool as the temperature on the helicopter landing pads could reach over 130 degrees. Through your generosity we received over \$1,000 and purchased lots of red, white and blue banners, flags and bunting. The team thought that kerchiefs with gel packs in them would be perfect so I set out to find the most inexpensive gel pack available. Talking to a Canadian company one day, I realized that we wouldn't be able to afford 25 of their gel packs much less the 100 I wanted to send. They had a great product but it was very expensive. The salesman called me back later in the day and asked how much we had budgeted for the packs. I told him \$300. He said that was great, because he had been authorized to make sure we could afford the 200 gel packs that they would be mailing to us, and because what we were doing was for such a worthy cause, \$300 would cover the cost. With the help of Pak Mail we were able to ship everything to William who expressed his appreciation and that of the men!

Our goal is to send mission teams regionally or nationally on alternate years, one year in our community and the next wherever we are most needed. An ongoing project we are hoping to become involved in locally is with one of our local deputy sheriffs, Tony Wooten. He has begun providing latch key children with back packs that he fills with snacks to make sure they have something to eat when they arrive home alone. This mission would be a year round monetary commitment, and the Session will vote on this at our December meeting.

Last of all we are asking for donations during December to purchase toys for children in Dawson County whose parents have no means of providing Christmas for them and were either not able or not willing to sign up with Care for Kids. Again we will be helping Deputy Wooten with the means to purchase the toys.

Your Evangelism and Missions Team supports and coordinates five offerings during the year. These include: One Great Hour of Sharing, Pentecost, Presbyterian Homes, Peacemaking, and Christmas Joy Offering. We also support Young Life, NOA (No One Alone) and the Missions budget of Cherokee Presbytery. We participate locally in the Dawson County Church Alliance, and jointly support local mission projects.

A plan to install two dental chairs and a service to offer eye exams in 2014 is also moving forward.

GRACE IN A BOX: GIB is providing boxed takeaway lunches for patients going to the Good Shepherd Clinic for medical treatment.

RIC-RACK: Grace Church continues to support the Ric-Rack by sponsoring food drives every third Sunday of the month to help stock their food pantry. As part of the church alliance, we also volunteer to take a turn every other month for three days to work at the food pantry helping to distribute food to those in need. More volunteers are needed to help. Our next rotation at the food pantry is November 10, 12, and 14th.


