



Happy Birthday Corvette! America's Favorite Sports Car Turns 64 Years Old This Month!

Sixty-four years ago at a small factory in Flint, Michigan on Van Slyke Road, the first 1953 Corvettes rolled off the assembly line and into automotive history. On June 30th 1953, these Chevrolet workers and executive gathered for a group photo around the VIN 001 Corvette.



In the early 1950's, Harley Earl, GM's head of styling, envisioned a low-cost American sports car

that could compete with Europe's Jaguar, MG's and Ferrari. Codenamed "Opel", the very first prototype made its debut in January 1953 at the GM Motorama show at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City. The great reviews and pubic acclaim for the little white roadster prompted GM to fast track the Corvette into production and the first retail models were hand assembled in the back of the Chevrolet's Customer Delivery Center in Flint, Michigan just six months later.

Chevrolet built 300 Corvettes over the course of the 1953 model year. A uniform design allowed the workers to concentrate on putting the bodies together without being distracted by trim and equipment variations. Therefore, all 1953 Corvettes were Polo White with Sportsman Red interiors and equipped with a canvas soft-top, 6.70×15 whitewall tires and a Delco signal-seeking radio. Also standard was a 5,000-rpm tachometer and a counter for total engine revolutions.

Although some sports car purists took exception to the Corvette's only available transmission – the 2-speed Powerglide automatic, the Corvette was still a decent sports car with well-tuned examples running 0-60 mph in 11 seconds and having a top speed near 105 mph.


The Corvette's original base price was set at \$3,498.00. However the general public was hard pressed to get one as most of the production was doled out to project engineers, GM executives and other high profile customers including Hollywood movie stars like John Wayne. In fact a dealer notice issued in July '53 from the Central Office proclaimed: "No dealer is in a position to accept firm orders for delivery of a Corvette in 1953."


The Chevrolet Corvette has come a long way since that first 1953 rolled off the assembly line. While we celebrate all Corvettes on this birthday, it all started 64 years ago:

25 Years Ago: Chevrolet Builds the 1 Millionth Corvette

As we just celebrated the 64th birthday of the Chevrolet Corvette, this weekend another milestone for the Corvette occurred 25 years ago on.

That's the day that the 1 millionth Corvette rolled off the Bowling Green assembly line. The 1992 Corvette convertible was outfitted the way the original 1953 Corvette appeared – white with a red interior.





(Corvette Chief Engineer), Zora Arkus-Duntov (Corvette Chief Engineer, retired) and Jim Perkins (Chevrolet GM), along with Bowling Green Plant Manager Paul Schnoes and UAW Local 2164 President Billy Jackson.

The 1 Millionth Corvette was one of the Great Eight Corvettes to be swallowed by a sinkhole at the National Corvette Museum in February 2014. Once the 1992 Corvette was rescued, Chevrolet took the milestone car back to Detroit where a rebuild team made up of 30 people from GM Design's Mechanical Assembly Group took four months and spend some 1,200 man-hours to fully restore the car, including the hundreds of signed components by those that assembled the car in Bowling Green.

The restored 1 Millionth Corvette returned to the National Corvette Museum in September 2015 and can be seen on display with the restored 2009 Corvette ZR1 and the other six Corvettes rescued from the sinkhole

June 2017 Corvette Sales

General Motors has issued the sales numbers for June 2017 and Corvette sales remain strong as the first 2018 model year Corvettes were delivered to new owners during the month.

The June 2017 Corvette Sales Report shows that 2,612 Corvettes were sold during the month, an increase of 5.2% over the same time period in 2016. For Calendar Year to Date sales, Chevrolet has delivered 13,707



Corvettes from January 1 to June 30th, a decrease of -6.6% from 2016's 14,668 Corvettes sold over the same dates.

The 2018 Corvette officially started production on June 5th and customers were already taking delivery of their new cars by the end of the month.

In an exclusive report last week, the Corvette Team told us that nearly 400 orders have been accepted for the new 2018 Carbon 65 Corvettes and that Chevrolet will build around 350 of the planned 650 cars prior to the summer factory shutdown. Production will resume on the limited edition Grand Sports and Z06s in November.

Chevrolet's offers page is only featuring one incentive – 4.9% APR financing for 60 months on all 2017 Corvette models (Base, Z51, Grand Sport and Z06) however, that incentive ends on July 5th. We expect the incentives to end as Chevrolet will be producing no Corvettes for three months and will let the market reduce its inventory through attrition.

General Motors sold 202,908 vehicles in June 2017 to retail customers and 243,155 total vehicles overall. Total sales were down about 3 percent from last year.

Chevrolet's retail sales totaled 138,996 and are down -1.5% for the month. Crossover sales continue to lead the growth with sales up 42 percent: The Traverse was up 71% while Equinox sales were up 36%.

The Corvette Assembly Plant's Three Month Shutdown to Begin July 28th

Amid speculation on the Web that the General Motors Bowling Green
Assembly Plant is getting ready for a new generation that could include hybrid or mid-engine Corvettes, most workers at the Kentucky plant will take off beginning July 28 and won't be returning to work until October.

That was the word from Plant Manager Kai Spande, who talked last Thursday about the upcoming 13-



week shutdown during the awarding of the plant's grants to local non-profit organizations.

Fortunately, the plant has already assembled some 2018 Corvettes in the past few weeks for delivery during the shutdown, but production and delivery of what will be the fifth year of the C7 models won't resume again until November.

Spande said the shutdown will allow installation of equipment, setting up a new car build process for the 2018 Corvette, and getting the nearly \$500 million new paint shop up and running.

Meanwhile, a United Auto Workers Local 2164 leader said some areas of the plant will still be on the job during the shutdown, "mostly painters."

Vice President Jack Bowers told a reporter for The Bowling Green Daily News that all of the 838 permanent employees should be back at work in October, but the several hundred temporary workers who also help produce the Corvette won't return immediately.

"It will be a slow, steady process when you do this level of restructuring in the plant," Bowers said. "We're basically rearranging things so that parts coming from the paint area are coming from a different area, and we'll be using a conveyor system to bring all parts over to be assembled. It will take at least a month to get things rolling."

In an earlier story, we told you the new paint facility is on the other side of the factory than the previous paint shop. So moving the panel assembly areas closer to the new paint shop means that there is less opportunity for those newly painted parts to get dinged or damaged as the car moves through the assembly process. Second is the fact that they want to change the current assembly layout so those painted panels are among the last steps of the assembly process, again to mitigate the potential for damage as the car is being assembled.

Finally, the general assembly process will be transformed by utilizing flexible assembly methods that feature robotic delivery of parts and components to the stations as well as allowing the worker greater access to the vehicle and its sub-systems during assembly. An example is the engine dress line that will allow workers to easily rotate the engines to make it as easy and as accessible as possible for the worker to do their jobs.

Another significant move is the time for each worker to install the parts. Currently, the assembly line moves at a rate of 17 cars completed per hour. This will be decreased to 12 cars per hour as the workers will get an additional two minutes per car (from three minutes to five minutes) at each of their stations. Not only does this allow the worker more time to do their jobs, but it should also increase quality as they will have more time to inspect and review the cars as they go down the line. The rate of 12 cars per hour is not something that can be changed. At the NCM Bash in April, Kai said if you want to build more cars, then you need more hours to do so, not a faster running line.

At the Bash, he showed how the current line features a lot of steel scaffolding and an inflexible line that carries parts through the factory. Another key stat is that currently 80% of the parts are delivered via forklifts. Following the upgrades much of the scaffolding and delivery of parts will be replaced with a new system of automated guided carriers which are essentially robots that follow a predetermined path to deliver the completed sub-assemblies or the other parts needed for building the cars.

Of course, with the plant closed for the renovations, the factory tours are shut down, and we've been told they may not resume until early 2019 – a move that has caused speculation that GM doesn't want prying eyes seeing any eighth generation models widely rumored to be the long-awaited mid-engine Holy Grail.

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
