At first glance First Christian Church's 2010 may not strike anyone as more than another good year in the life of a church. After taking a closer look, I find there are many significant events in the life of the church that cumulatively make 2010, not only good, but great. The true life of a church is not found in the events that we host, but in the changed lives of individuals. At most Elders' meetings, I share stories from the lives of you, our church family. I wish I could somehow share all these glimpses of God's work with all of you, but instead we will have to be satisfied with a recounting of some of the significant events in the life of FCC as a whole. Some were first time attempts that we will revisit again. Other events were resurrected from our history for another good run. There may be events and activities that were not listed that you feel should have made the list. If so, I apologize. It was my oversight. If you would, please let me know how they impacted your life. Here are some of the significant events and activities of 2010 in the life of FCC.

Children's Ministry – It was a year of transition. We said farewell to Liz Spray as she stepped down from the leadership as Children's Director to care for her young family. Within a couple of months, we hired Eden Maynard. Eden has learned quickly how to keep up with the fast pace ministry of FCC. She is an asset to our staff team, our children's ministry, and the whole church.

Baby Dedication Sunday – We have had baby dedications for decades. This year we made an attempt at having one special Sunday set aside to dedicate the children born to families of FCC. Several families participated in this meaningful service. This heightens the value of committing our children, as parents and as a church, to God.

Haiti Trip – A group of 9 went to Haiti to continue building our partnership with LaPlaine, a small community in a impoverished area. We participated in a dedication service of the building that you, the people of FCC, funded. We delivered the water filters you provided for the people of LaPlaine to have clean water. The sewing ministry that we began has the potential of helping them get themselves out of the cycle of poverty. We were even able to send video from Haiti for use on a Sunday morning service. The trip raised the bar for FCC's hands on involvement in missions.

Camp Barnabas – Our High School and College age students went as servants to those who are handicapped. The week they went was wheelchair week. This was a significant stretch to the faith of those who went. It heightened the value of service for our young people, and our church.

EQ – EQ stands for "Equip." Over 80 people were able to participate in this three session leadership development for people of FCC. It was an investment that will bring great rewards for years to come. The response was overwhelmingly positive and we are already looking forward to the next EQ in the fall of 2011. This raises the value of leadership discipleship in FCC.

House of Prayer – A small group of people are being used to move big obstacles. This group meets every Thursday night to pray. They pray for the physical needs of the people of FCC. But they also pray for the spiritual mission, vision, leaders, future, and hearts and minds of FCC. I am convinced that the success of FCC as measured by God will only come when supported by the faithful prayers of his people. This raises the value of prayer in the life of FCC.

We are truly blessed. I grew up in the church, volunteered in churches, and served several churches. I have to say, I have never seen a staff that works as well together as the one with which we are blessed. I have ever growing confidence in our team and their devotion to God and the First Christian Church. Here are some things that I feel that I hope you have seen too.

Randall – I am thankful for his partnership in preaching. His work in the area of discipleship has the potential of revolutionizing the way we walk with people towards full devotion to Jesus. In administration he is diligent in the details of many projects. He has a big heart for community and care of the church family.

Greg - He regularly goes the extra mile, is multitalented, and helps everyone's ministries succeed. He is more than a worship arts minister. He is a servant to all. He regularly challenges us towards creativity and excellence in all areas of ministry. Much of the positive things that stand out about FCC, he has a hand in creating.

Marshal – He has a strong grasp of the needs of youth and families of teenagers. He is a team player, a big brother (to Eden). His ministry continues to expand beyond the youth, into the congregation and community. He is ever looking to improve the way we do what we do, pushing us to action.

Eden – She is a busy bee behind the scenes. Her hard work makes the difficult task of leading the children's program seem manageable. Her efforts continue to introduce Jesus to children and deepen their faith in him. Her role is possibly the hardest position on the team, and she carries the load well.

Thanks team. I get way more credit and far less criticism than I deserve.

FCC's year cannot be summarized by a couple of pages, but I trust these words have helped. With the paid and unpaid (volunteer) staff God has blessed us with, the guidance he continues to give, and the blessing of God's hand, I am excited for what God has for our future. May 2010 be seen as building on the foundation of years past so that 2011 and beyond will be better than ever.

The three statistics that are most easily measured are new members, attendance, and giving. In 2010 we added 30 new members and had 30 baptisms. Below is a list of those who joined through transfer and those who were baptized. Our average attendance was up from last year by 13, or about 3.4%. We miss several of our friends who have moved to another town, found another church home, or have gone home to heaven. Even with their loss, there is great encouragement from the continual number of new people who visit and make FCC their home. The final measurement I will share is giving. Our average weekly general fund giving was again at a record high.

2010 Highlights:

Sunday Service reminders are sent by email. The Link is now sent out mostly by email. Because of the electronic Link our Link budget was decreased by \$2,000 for the year. We previously mailed 500 Links each week. We now mail 145. This has cut our mail preparation time down from 2 hours to about 40 minutes. And decreased the number of volunteers needed from 4 to 1. We send out 360 email Links and this only takes about 15 minutes. The office has been remodeled. The result is an organized space for the office staff and a separate, useful and organized space for volunteers that reflects our appreciation for their hard work. The remodel makes it possible for the office to adjust efficiently as church attendance grows. We utilize Servant Keeper to maintain visitor records and other groups such as singles, 20-somethings, baby dedication, a closer look, etc... We have changed our filing system to filing by vender rather than by month. We have cleared out old items from the office and made room to store more recent items in the office. We upgraded our Quickbooks software. We purchased a wireless phone piece that enables all calls to be received in a timely way and allows for movement throughout the church by office staff while still answering phones. We added locks to one cupboard in the office for a little added security of church owned property of value.

Improvement plans:

Complete the remodel by making new mail boxes and finishing the volunteer sign and the bulletin board. We plan to continue to improve our email communication abilities. I would love to find a better way to keep our church member information up to date so that our directories are always correct. As the remodel is finished we plan to maintain an office that is free of clutter and is warm and inviting as well as efficient and useful. We plan to have one additional volunteer to maintain our files. This has just begun and we will monitor this and make sure it is effective and efficient. We are doing better at getting initial information from people who join, or are baptized but this process needs to continue to improve.
