### Upcoming tournaments offer ACC golfers fun, friendly competition

Not many things beat a fun, competitive tourney at the Augusta Country Club. Be sure to mark your calendars and register for our upcoming tournaments!

#### Couples Tournament

The Annual Augusta Country Club Couples Tournament will be held Sunday, August 24 with a shotgun start at 2 PM. The format will be a couple's alternate ball with each player hitting from the tee box. The club will provide the meat dish for the dinner afterwards and each couple is asked to bring a covered dish. There will be closest to the hole prizes on par 3 holes as well as prize money for well scoring teams. Registration is \$30 for member couples with full cart membership, \$50 for member couples without full cart membership and \$70 for non-members. There is a sign up sheet in the clubhouse or call the club, 775-7281, to register.

#### Labor Day Tournament

The Annual Labor Day Tournament will be held Monday, September 1 (Labor Day) with a 9:30 Shotgun start. The entry fee is \$30 and will include lunch. The

format will be "Six Pack". Sign up at the clubhouse or call in your registration.

#### Club Championship

This is the second biggest golf event of the year for Augusta Country Club golfers. The Championship will be held Saturday and Sunday, September 13 and 14. Tee times are 9 AM on both days. Lunch will be served both days. There will be three flights plus a Senior Flight. The entry fee is \$50 for both days plus cart fee, if needed.

#### Two-Man Invitational Shamble

This event will be held on September 27 and 28. The format is shamble with three flights of golfers according to handicap. Teams with more than a 7 stroke differential between players will receive a handicap adjustment. There is a limit of 36 teams and registrations will have to be made not later than September 25 to allow the club to get more carts if needed. The entry fees are members with full cart - \$100, members without full cart membership - \$120 and guest - \$160. Tee times will be noon Saturday and 8 AM Sunday. Dinner will be served Saturday and lunch Sunday.

### New golf practice, warm-up range ready and waiting!



Augusta Country Club has new electric golf carts as well as a new practice and warm-up range.

The Augusta Country Club's new range and warm up facility recently opened. It is located on the site of the old driving range just south of the fairway on the number 5 hole. The range sports the latest in artificial turf from which to practice and can be used nearly year round and in nearly all conditions.

Range balls are available in the clubhouse for as little as \$3.00 for members for a small bucket. Annual range memberships are also available for \$150.00.

Please remember this is a practice facility and only irons can be used. Drivers and fairway woods should not be used. Shag bags are also prohibited.

## Got golf? ACC groups give players more golfin' options

If you are looking for a group to play golf with, we have several available at the Augusta Country Club. Please don't feel bashful to invite yourself to play in any of these groups.

### Noon group

This group doesn't always play at exactly noon but they play every day that the weather permits from Monday through Friday. Start times depend on the weather. Check with the clubhouse or Bill Richey as to exact times. They play a game that allows for golfers of all abilities to join in.

### 19th Hole Club

Each Tuesday evening during the spring, summer and early fall this group of men gather for golf and excellent cuisine prepared by club member Dave Hornkamp. Tee time is 6 PM but it helps to draw teams if everyone is registered by 5:30. If you are running late call the clubhouse and they will get you registered. Most weeks the cost is \$20.00 but some meals can cost extra. Dave cooks everything from prime steaks to chicken enchiladas. Sometimes he throws in some home-made ice cream.

### Ladies Night

Each Thursday evening during the golfing season the ladies gather to golf. Scramble is usually the format. Tee time is 6 PM and you can register in person or by calling the clubhouse.

### Weekly League

This league started in the early spring and runs till fall. It is a series of two person matches. The league will be available for a few new teams next spring. Contact Ralph Stareck for information or to reserve a spot for your team next year. The entry fee is only \$20 for 22 golf matches.

### Couple's Night

Each Friday a number of couple gather to play nines holes of relaxing scramble with their significant other. The fee is only \$10.00 and comes back in prize money. The teams try to get started by 6 PM so get there early or call the clubhouse to tell them you are coming.

### Sunday Group

This group of men play every Sunday morning at 9 AM, weather permitting.
