We are very thankful for the three that followed the Lord in baptism. We are so excited to see the door opening as we teach sign language at the Bible Institute. Our students' parents are asking questions and we are very encouraged as we answer them. This is a major blessing! We are looking forward to an evangelistic outreach that will be held in January. We are inviting our parents to attend along with our students and other members. Continue to pray for the members of our church as they grow spiritually and for their faithfulness to God.

We are asking for prayers as we continue to pursue adoption. We should have our home study finished soon and ask you to pray for the Lord's working in all of this. As we are very anxious to have a child soon, we will trust and wait on the Lord.

We will be heading up to the border to take care of some paperwork soon, and please pray for our safety and that the paperwork goes through smoothly. We are still trying to obtain permanent visas but see God's working in the waiting. I have heard from a friend that the law will be changing soon and the year visas will be extended to 4 years. What a blessing this would be - less travel and more time for the ministry! We are trying to get the Christian school for the deaf up and running. While waiting on curriculum from another school, we have begun teaching them one on one. A school setting would be more advantageous as the fellowship of other students would be a major help for them all. May God bless you and your families at this time of remembering Christ's birth and the salvation it brought to all mankind!

The students are doing quite a bit of the labor to help keep our expenses at a minimum. In fact, one night some of the equipment broke down so the guys worked until 4:00 a.m. getting the roof poured!
