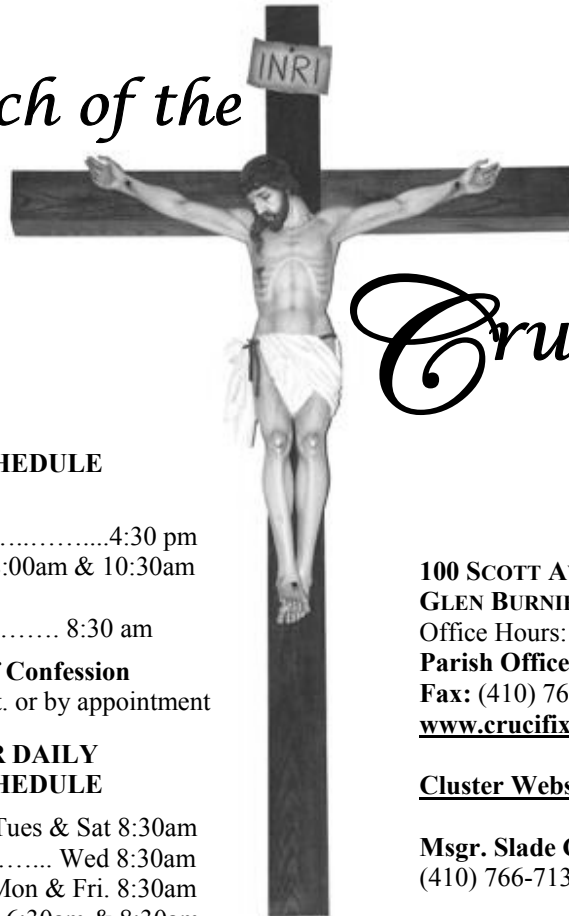

**SACRAMENTS**

***Baptism:*** Celebrated on first Sunday of the month. Parents must attend preparation classes. Please call the parish office to make arrangements.

***Marriage:*** Couples should contact the priest before a setting a date for their wedding in order to ensure church availability. Participation in a marriage preparation program is required and couples are encouraged to begin preparations 9-12 months prior to their wedding date.

***Anointing of the Sick:*** This sacrament of healing is intended for those who are ill or infirm. Parishioners scheduled for surgery are encouraged to contact the parish office prior to hospital admission and always in cases of emergency.

**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

***Religious Education*** Classes are held for children age PK-4 to 8<sup>th</sup> grade on Sunday mornings from 9:15 to 10:15am at Marley Elementary School.

***Children's Ministry*** is held during the Liturgy of the Word at the 10:30am Mass and offers children ages 4 years old – 5<sup>th</sup> grade activities and reflections based on the Sunday readings. (Note: This does not replace your child's regular Religious Education classes.)

***First Reconciliation and First Eucharist:*** In order to receive these sacraments, children must be enrolled in the Religious Education program for two years prior to beginning the preparation classes in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade. Please call the parish office for more information.

***Confirmation:*** This Sacrament is celebrated in the 9<sup>th</sup> grade. Candidates must be Baptized, have already received Eucharist and Reconciliation, and be enrolled in the Religious Education program at least one year prior to beginning the preparation program in 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

***High School Youth Ministry:*** Please call the Parish Office for information.

**PROCLAIM GOD’S GLORY**

*A threefold message develops in today’s readings. First, everyone is called to proclaim God’s glory and receive salvation. Second, salvation is not for the unprepared. Like a loving parent, God gently corrects and disciplines those who have been called. Usually suffering is part of the formation process. We are to accept it as Jesus once accepted his cross.*

*Third, some people who imagine themselves saved are really not. The door of salvation has been closed in their faces despite their cries and pleas. On the other hand, some who are treated with contempt and disdain actually do have a place in God’s kingdom.*

*We need to take these lessons to heart. Recall your initial excitement on hearing God’s word. How has the Good News that once caught your fancy taken deeper root in your life? Look again at the crosses you have been given. How are others transformed when they see how you have accepted and grown from your sufferings?*

*Finally, are there some people whom you imagine are not invited to God’s kingdom? Why do you think so? For a moment, imagine them on the inside and yourself on the outside. How might this be possible?*

*Always try your best to enter by the narrow door. Come and proclaim God’s glory.*

**What does it involve?**

- The chalice is sent home at the end of Mass every weekend, at the Mass of your choice.
