Baba Hannibal Afrik has given leadership and service to the Black Liberation Movement for over four decades as a Pan-Afrikan Nationalist community activist, educator, author, husband, father and institution-builder.

He is the Founding Elder for the BOLOZI WAZEE (Council of Elders) SHULE YA WATOTO (School For Children) in Chicago; National Public Relations Officer, Council of Independent Black Institutions (CIBI); consultant, School Tech Services and past national co-chair, National Coalition of Blacks for Reparations in America (NCOBRA).

Baba Afrik has participated in a wide variety of Pan-Afrikan formations and has been nationally recognized as an Elder and enstooled as Abusuapanin (Elder Head of Family) to Nana Kofi Amowi I in the town of Agona-Duakwa, Ghana in 1999. His work with youth and families in Afrikan-centered education earned him the status of Mzee and Training Elder in several Rites of Passage organizations.

He currently resides in Port Gibson, Claiborne County, Mississippi studying Rural Community Development and serves as the Executive Director, Community Youth Achievers, Inc., a public charitable organization. Additionally, Baba Hannibal is the State Coordinator, Mississippians For Reparations and is a citizen/worker with the local cadre of KUSH DISTRICT New Afrikan Nationalists and Survival Training Elder with the Outdoor Leadership Skills Project (OLSP), Base Camp ALAJO.

Afrik is a widower and father of four children, four grandchildren and two great - grandchildren.
