Who, or What are you Constructing?

What a question. You might think that this is a trick question. Your answer may be that you only worship Jesus. That may be your answer, but is it the truth. If someone could follow you every day knowing your thoughts, hearing your words and seeing your deeds, would they define you as a worshiper of God- Father, Son and Holy Spirit? Holy Scripture says that to have a god is nothing else than to trust and believe in that one, or that thing, with your whole heart-with all of your being. Does that describe you? Maybe not, but does that mean we have idols in our life? We all have people, places and things that rank high on our priority list. But do we worship created things instead of the Creator?

As I prepare for a devotion for the Oklahoma Church Workers Conference, my mind roams through the Old Testament. God led His chosen people through the Red Sea and then destroyed their enemies; led them through the desert fire by night and cloud by day, all the time supplying all their needs; and finally into a promised land He had chosen for them. While in the desert at Mt Sinai, Moses went to be with God for a period of time. We are told during that time the people gathered gold to construct a golden calf which was to symbolize the god that had delivered them. They wanted their god in a place where they could always find him; they wanted a god that was under their control. They had forgotten the man does not define God-God defines himself. But sadly man defining God continues even today.

In Exodus 3:14 God tells Moses His name, "I am -Who I am; or I will be -Who I will be". Our God is defined only by Himself and His Word. But today have we constructed beliefs about God that we think define Him? Do we redefine following, disciple, salvation and other key components given to us in God's Word?

When I was young I met a man who told me that God would not want us Christians to go through life not having the best. As I searched the Bible I found that we have the best in Jesus, but in this life we are told we will suffer. Had this man constructed an idol? There are those that spend almost all their time seeking after things money can buy. Are they worshipping mammon (money)? Jesus says "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matt 6:21) Is our heart not fully sold on our God?

This is not a question I can answer. I know that I struggle with: is this what God wants me to do; is this what God wants me to say to the congregation; is this the direction the church should go? These questions torment me and satan tries to lead me astray.

But that is when we should get out the directions and consult God's Word to make sure what we are building is true. It is very easy for all of us to be deceived if we do not know God the way He defines Himself. I pray that you are not constructing a god that is based on what someone says, or what you think, or according to the latest book you read. God says to you and to me, "I am Who I am", not who you might say I am.

So stay in the Word and it will tell you just Who God is. And God is building you into something special through the faith He puts in you. Through this faith you can relay to your children, families and neighbors just Who your God is. For our God and our salvation is found in Jesus, the living Word.

We are hard pressed on every side, but not crushed; perplexed, but not in despair; persecuted, but not abandoned; struck down, but not destroyed."* I know that when my weakness is the weakest, God will give me the strength to overcome any obstacle.

Speaking of *Portals of Prayer*, this month has been enjoyable. There have been many readings from Peter. When I read Peter's writings alone I usually tend to get that lost feeling. He wrote so deeply, maybe because he was one of the closest to the Savior and kept tripping over his own tongue. Peter wrote for us to be alert and to be self-controlled, to love greatly and to be humble, be submissive and be respectful of all authority, be a gentle shepherd of those entrusted to you, be prepared to say who you are and Who your faith lies in.

I have an idea! How about we practice our preparedness, like with a secret code amongst our closest friends? In personal conversations with other members who may have read this, have a secret code. I don't mean a secret handshake, but a secret question and answer, like in the spy movies. Instead of saying how are you today, let's try, who are you today. Got it? Let's try it out. You say "Who are you today?" And I reply something like "A firm believer in Jesus Christ, my personal Savior" or, "A witness testifying what Jesus has done for me." And then the appropriate response to that will be, "And what has Jesus done for you?" and I say, "with His body and blood He paid my debt in full so that I might be considered holy and welcome in the presence of the Almighty God." Am I getting too wordy? I have another idea; maybe Ms. Susan will make a mailbox for me along with the others (can I have a bottom row, please?) and you can leave me messages with your ideas for the secret question and answer. What would be so easy that you would practice it often enough so that it becomes automatic in your everyday conversations with those outside the circle of your closest friends? Or let's put it another way, what do you hear God telling you to say

Ding, ding, ding, I have another idea! Since I have heard talk of Steve Cohen coming to visit, I am sure he will give lots of examples on how we can be witnesses of our faith. After reading about him and the Apple of His Eye ministry, I cannot wait to hear all his ideas. I have plenty of notebooks and my pencils are sharpened and ready to take notes. This is gonna be good, especially since I saw in the paper that there will be refreshments. Ahhh, I'm feeling refreshed already.

And, again I will leave you with words written by Luke, *However, I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace.* Acts 20:24 Well, I gotta go; I'm off to see if Ms. Susan will let me have my mailbox. I sure hope so. Bye for now.

Christ Lutheran School Enrolling for 2011/12

Have you decided where your soon to be PS 3, 4 or Kindergartener will go to school next year? Look no further. Christ Lutheran School has several openings in all three classes for the next school year. PS 3s meet on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. The cost is \$70 a month with a \$35 enrolment fee. The PS 4s meet on Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. The cost is \$90 a month with a \$45 enrollment fee. We have ALL DAY Kindergarten. The class meets from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. every day. The cost is \$250 with a \$75 enrollment fee. Childrens' lives will be greatly enriched as they learn the love of Jesus along with their ABCs and 123s. Students engage in Bible stories, have music each week, Chapel time twice a month with Pastor Dave and also go on field trips. At print date, five were enrolled in the KG class (maximum 14), three in the PS 3s (maximum 12) and one in the PS 4s (maximum 12).

Mission Project: Collecting Books for Peppers Ranch Foster Care Community

This organization sound familiar? It probably does because LWML sponsored it a few years ago to receive the Angel Tree donations and it will again this year. But for now, LWML asks you to join them in collecting books for its new library. The books should be for younger children, said Amber Given, program director at the Ranch. The Ranch is starting a reading

program, where the kids will earn the opportunity to get into the "treasure chest" and pick a prize based on the number of books they read. Small gifts for the chest would be greatly appreciated as well. Thank you for any donations you are able to give!

Peppers Ranch, a Foster Care Community, located 160 acres north of Edmond and west of Guthrie exists for the continued goal of providing quality, planned care for abused and neglected children. Designed to help children break the cycle of abuse and neglect, the ranch provides a disciplined environment in which the children are challenged and encouraged to develop responsible behavioral skills, academic standards, social discipline, spiritual principles and physical activity. Sibling relations are emotionally powerful and critically important and the community places strong emphasis on keeping sibling groups together; thus avoiding children being bounced around in "the system." By design, the ranch enables foster parents to maintain a long term commitment to the children in their care. It is our goal to provide foster families resources thus enabling them to provide youth with the tools to not just get by in life, but to become happy, successful and independent adults. In addition to housing, the ranch has an Equestrian Center, an Ag Center a Multi-Purpose Learning Center, a baseball field, soccer field, playground area, fort and a stocked 8 acre pond. In March of 2010 an additional 80 acres, contiguous to Peppers Ranch, was donated to the ranch, expanding the ranch to 240 acres.

Christ is the Passion Presented April 10, Both Services

Steve Cohen, founder of Apple of His Eye Ministries, will be here on Sunday, April 10, to provide a Passover Meal with explanation. Following is a note from Cohen, off the Apple of His Eye web site. *SHALOM TO YOU AT THIS PASSOVER/EASTER SEASON!*

The staff and volunteers of The Apple of His Eye want to thank you for celebrating the Passover. We remember once again the story of God's deliverance of our people from Egypt. In the Passover we see the foreshadowing of God's plan of redemption of all mankind from sin through Jesus, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

When we began our missionary efforts in 1996, we did so in the hopes and prayer that caring Christians would partner with us to reach all people, including the Jewish people, with the message of Messiah. What began as a file folder and a dream is now a growing movement.

To date, we have helped open new mission stations in St. Louis, Houston, New York City and Los Angeles. We have helped in the planting of a Lutheran messianic congregation in St. Louis led by Rev. Kevin Parviz. We have established a new missionary training center to prepare people for the task and challenges of missionary life among a sometimes Gospel resistant people. We are developing new evangelistic materials and media to help people through printed literature, new technologies and on the internet that we might reach beyond the mere length of our arms. We have written and produced 70 new Gospel tracts and conducted annual short term mission events for training since 1997.

Our mission statement is to boldly declare Y'shua as Messiah to Jewish people and urgently equip Christians to do the same.
