

Youth Report

Last week I attended a yearly retreat for all candidates who are in seminary, or in the process of discernment for seminary. This retreat takes place from Wednesday at noon until Thursday at noon. 24 hours. This was my third retreat. During these retreats we worship, network, eat amazing food, and sometimes take part in a panel discussion. These panels are broken into three distinct phases of this candidacy journey. My first year, I took part in a panel to be entranced. Before being able to go to seminary I needed to be entranced by our candidacy committee. The other two panels are for endorsement and approval. I have not done these yet. Endorsement will take place before I embark on my internship year in the Fall of 2017. Approval will take place following internship and is one of the final steps towards being approved to become a pastor in the Lutheran church.

I share this with you because whether you know it or not, you are all on this journey with me. Whether you contribute through prayer, financially, or by your affirming words you are helping me through this phase of my life. I want you to know where I am and what is going on. This 5-year journey I am on has many unanswered questions, but I want to inform you as much as I can so that you can continue walking side by side with me.

I struggled to find motivation for this year's candidacy retreat. I did not have a panel discussion and was not sure what the point of even going would be. I would have to miss one of our Wednesday youth nights. I would have to miss Christmas caroling and delivering some treats and crafts we made for the people we would visit. I did not want to miss this to go on a retreat that would provide little to nothing for me.

Wednesday night, I had a realization. The Holy Spirit reshaped my focus and put things into a whole new perspective. I am not sure why I came into this retreat with such a selfish focus. Wednesday night as we sat around a table, there were pastors, seminarians, and a select few people who were trying to figure out if seminary is the route they were called to go.

This retreat was not about me. I am here for them. I am here to help answer whatever questions they may have. I remember my first retreat. I was buried deep in stress, fear, and had absolutely no idea what I was getting myself in. There were two current seminarians that really provided that comfort and guidance that I needed.

Sometimes it's not about how this benefits me. Sometimes our calling goes deeper than that. Sometimes our God wants to use us in ways we cannot yet see. Sometime our calling is serve our neighbor without even realizing it.

Wednesday night was a beautiful reminder of this message. We are called as brothers and sisters in Christ to love God with all our heart, soul, strength, and mind. We are also to love our neighbors as our self. Even if we think there's nothing in it for us. There is more then our eyes allow us to see.


